

Over June and July 2025, the AI Nigeria Volunteers' Sit-Out swept across 14 states, bringing together 468 participants — 311 returning volunteers and 155 new ones, including 224 males and 247 females.

In just one cycle, 14 states, 468 participants, and a mix of 311 returning volunteers and 155 new sign-ups came together to sharpen their skills, deepen their understanding of Amnesty's mission, and plan real-world actions that make a difference.

It matters because movements only stay alive when people are connected, informed, and ready to act. The Sit-Out turns online interest into offline commitment, transforms first-time participants into confident activists, and gives experienced volunteers the space to mentor and inspire others.



State Highlight

Each state Sit-Out was run using the Implementation Toolkit shared with coordinators, ensuring activities followed a clear structure.

Volunteers began with an introduction to Amnesty International's mission and roles, then discussed mob violence and ways to promote justice without jungle justice.

Sessions covered urgent-action processes, campaign tools, and how volunteers can engage effectively. Participants worked in groups, shared ideas, and ended with a pledge, photos, and social media posts amplifying the #JusticeNotJungle message.


